This training program was designed to enhance the ability of the initial responding officer to obtain accurate and reliable information from individuals encountered throughout their shift, and to assist them with distinguishing between truthful information and possible deception, which is a critical skill and safety issue for patrol officers. Also, it is the patrol force and first responders who frequently have the initial contact with victims, witnesses and suspects within investigations. It is this initial contact that can lead an investigation in the proper direction or misdirect it down the wrong path resulting in inaccurate or incomplete information. This training will not only improve the investigations of the first responding officer, but the information obtained will be better suited for investigative follow-up by detectives if the investigation is passed on. Statement Analysis is a highly effective method of obtaining information from people and to assist with distinguishing between truthfulness and deception within written statements as well as oral communication such as field interviews, neighborhood canvasses, roadside questioning, investigative interviews and criminal interrogations. At the end of this training students will have new skills to obtain information from people as well as the ability to better assess the information for deception and truthfulness.
